YOUR SCHOOL DAY

Presentation

Exercise books and folders should be well kept; you are usually allowed to cover them.

In every lesson you are expected to:

- Always write in **blue** or **black** ink.
- Use a pencil for drawing, tables and diagrams
- Use a ruler for drawing, underlining and labelling.
- Errors must be crossed off with one horizontal line.
- Glue in handouts neatly.
- Rule off after each piece and ensure that all pages/spaces are being used.
- Students are not to use Tippex or graffiti their book.



When you are presenting work, you should always have at the beginning:

- The date
- Your name and tutor group in the top right-hand corner when using loose paper
- A title underlined with a ruler
- Drawings and diagrams should be drawn using a sharp pencil.
- Labels should be written in ink.
- Coloured pencils should be used for colouring and shading.
- Do not use felt-tipped pens unless told to do so.

YOU CANNOT COME TO SCHOOL BECAUSE OF ILLNESS

Your parents should telephone the school every day and notify the absence line (PRESS OPTION 1) or email studentabsence@knoleacademy.org that you are absent, unless you have been advised by a doctor that you need to be off for a specific length of time, to explain why you will not be at school.

When you come back to school, bring in a note explaining your absence. Make sure the note gives the dates that you were absent.

YOU HAVE TO LEAVE SCHOOL EARLY



If you need to leave early for an appointment you should bring a note for your Form Tutor explaining why. Before leaving school you must sign out in Reception using the Year 7 signing out sheet.

YOU ARE LATE TO SCHOOL



Sign in at the AHOYs Office (Assistant Heads of Year) - make sure you use the Ipad to sign in. Then go straight to your locker and collect what you need for lessons. You must then go straight to your lesson.

YOU MISS THE BUS AFTER SCHOOL



At the end of the day come back into school and report to the Reception. The staff there will let you telephone your parents to make arrangements to get home.

YOU FEEL ILL



 If you feel ill during a lesson inform the teacher and they will advise you what to do.
 If you feel ill outside of lesson time you need to find your Head of Year.

If someone else is ill during the breaks or between lessons, you should either take them to their Head of Year or stay with them and send someone else to get their Head of Year.

IF YOU DAMAGE SCHOOL PROPERTY

You must report it.

- # Find a teacher immediately.
- * Explain what happened.
- # Tell your parents about it in the evening.

YOU LOSE SOMETHING



If you lose something during the day you should: # during break or lunchtime, retrace your movements looking in the teaching room that you were in. # see if it has been handed in at Reception. # report your loss to your Form Tutor, who will take the appropriate action that may help you to recover your property.

Lost PE equipment is usually returned to the **PE Office**, so try there as well. Lost property is often found by the cleaners and caretakers after school so remember to check the next day as well.

You must **put your name on all your possessions** – clothing and equipment. Do not bring jewellery, iPads, other valuables or large sums of money to school. If you need to, you should speak to your Form Tutor who may be able to arrange for its safekeeping – try to remember to do this before you bring anything valuable to school. When you have PE, hand in your valuables - do not leave them in blazers or bags. Mobile phones may be brought to school, but they must be turned off and kept in your locker; mobile phones are not to be used on school premises.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Knole Academy prides itself on excellent attendance. 100% is the expected attendance, the criteria for excellent attendance is + 99%. Students with excellent attendance at school are high achievers and achieve higher GCSE results. Every day in school counts. The following criteria apply to your attendance:

Try to ensure that your attendance remains above 95%, allowing you the time to achieve your potential. Missed days means missed learning.

If you are absent at the start of the school day, your parents or guardian are telephoned or sent a text message to verify that it is a genuine absence.

The following criteria applies to lateness to registration in an academic year.

Excellent	0 lates
Good	1-3 lates
Disappointing	4 - 11 lates
Cause of concern	12+ lates

Bronze Award: Year 7 / Silver Award: Year 8 / Ruby Award: Year 9

You complete various activities to achieve your Knole IB Bronze, Silver and Ruby Awards. To complete it, you must complete <u>at least</u> <u>one</u> session on <u>each</u> of the Learner Profiles. When you complete the award, you will receive a certificate and 10 house points.
